I had to laugh at Deb when she walked into the office and asked me to do a newsletter article. I asked what's in April and she said "April is nothing." I think in light of the recent weather (which I hope changes by the time this newsletter is out) I have begun to wonder if God is playing a big joke on us and skipping spring this year. Usually March brings some sense of the warming of weather, but the sun wasn't around much to help with that. However, in sheer determination to keep to the life cycles, the early plants are beginning to poke their heads above ground. Some look like they want to retreat back into the ground, but others are bravely reaching skyward in search for sun. As I write this, for the first time in days the sun greets us as day breaks and I am once again hopeful. Around here April is the month of hope, the month we see signs of new life and are reassured that spring will come and with it the blankets of color that splash the earth and signal to us that the time of rest is over, and the natural cycles of life continue.
