Have you ever noticed that fall begins with very subtle changes. A few leaves begin to yellow. Some of our flowering plants begin to wither. The nights begin to feel cooler. Our faith is just as valid in all of our lives, no matter what is happening around us and within us. So how do we rekindle the Spirit within us that called us to

Our plan is to provide one gift, a bible and a Christmas party. We will have our Angel Tree up in the narthex with the names of the children along with \$20 gift suggestions and 25 bible ornaments. Our task will be to purchase and wrap the gift on behalf of his/her incarcerated parent. Or provide funds to purchase a bible appropriate to the child's age. We then plan to have a Christmas party in Dec to present the gifts to the children from the parent and the church.

Our October noisy offering will be for this project to help buy the bibles. We will also be selling "stuffed owls." For each owl that is sold, the mission committee will received \$5.00. It is a great gift for children, grandchildren or angel tree children. Let's let the child of a prisoner know that they aren't forgotten and give them the joy of Christmas. This is a big challenge, but WE CAN DO IT!!

Music Ministry

In July Lois VanDyke fell off the organ bench during worship and has fractured her neck. She is home and healing. She and Bill still need your prayers because she will be in her uncomfortable neck brace for several more weeks. This brings us to the realization that once in a while, Lois and Cathy will be gone from worship at the same time. The question then becomes what do we do for music during worship when this happens?

Council discussed this and has a couple of options we are looking into along with Cathy Badge and Lois VanDykes input. Council will make a decision at the October meeting which direction we would like to pursue. Our options are:

- The Hymnal on CD: Cost is aound \$400 most is not organ music. We will be using a song or two from the CD sample on September 18th during worship.
- There is currently a box on the organ that is programmable but programs to 3 ¹/₂ inch floppy discs. This is very outdated and needs to be upgraded if we want to have Cathy or Lois preprogram whole worship services for us. Cathy has a quote from the organ company for upgrading the box so it will save digitally to a USB drive and can hold a full worship service and be run by remote even by the pastor if they will not be here. The cost for this upgrade including the box, installation, and an outside hard drive for back up is between \$2,300 and \$2,500. This Option will allow us to have organ music even if we don't have an organist for the day.

Currently we are just exploring options but know that we need to do something in the future. If you have any questions or would like to pledge towards the purchase of which ever option the council decides is the best please let the church office know. Questions regarding the programmable organ should be directed to Cathy Badge.
